


Plumstead Veterans

To further enshrine their legacy, I led the effort to dedicate six township bridges in honor of fallen residents—each one now a lasting tribute to their bravery. And our Veterans Day celebration has grown into a meaningful, heartfelt event that reflects the depth of appreciation we hold for those who served in our armed forces.
